

REGULATION OF THE GERMAN INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL in ABU DHABI (Status: March 2016)

The German International School sees itself as an intercultural community in which everyone treats each other with respect.

- 1. the pupils appear punctually at 7.50 a.m. for the flag roll call, with which our school day begins
- 2. there is peace and quiet in the school building during lessons. There is no running in the corridors.
- 3) The use of the climbing frame during the big breaks is regulated by a separate plan.
- 4) In the lower secondary school, the small breaks are only used to change to the classroom or subject room.
- 5. pupils in grades 5-9 may stay in the classrooms during the breaks from April/May to October/November. The school management decides on the exact date.
- 6) During the entire school period, students are not allowed to stay outside the school grounds. Pupils of classes 11 and 12 may leave the school grounds during lunch break after approval of the entire parental staff of these classes.
- 7. playing football is only allowed with foam balls Basketball balls are handed out by the break supervisor against signature.
- 8. entering the classrooms and the sports hall is only allowed in the presence of a teacher The regulations specific to the subject rooms must be observed.
- 9) Each student is jointly responsible for the order and cleanliness of the school.
- 10. at the end of the lessons according to the occupancy schedule, the teachers switch off the lights and take care of order and cleanliness.
- 11. the doors in the school building must be kept closed.

- 12) Any form of physical or mental violence is prohibited. Conflicts are to be settled peacefully, non-violently and amicably with the help of the mediators.
- 13. school property (furniture, books, equipment ...) is to be treated with care The pupils or their legal guardians are responsible for any damage caused.
- 14. waste is to be disposed of in the available containers.
- 15) The use of electronic devices is prohibited on the entire school premises unless written permission has been granted by a teacher.
- 16. access to the Internet may only be used for school purposes. Legal regulations are to be observed. Restrictions on use imposed by the school's youth protection regulations may not be circumvented.
- 17. we consider ourselves a smoke-free school. Therefore, smoking is not permitted on the entire school premises.
- 18. for health and hygienic reasons, chewing gum and the consumption of caffeinated beverages such as

like Coke, Red Bull... not allowed at the school. Glass bottles are not allowed on school grounds for safety reasons.

- 19. ordering and delivering food during school hours is prohibited.
- 20. parents are restricted to the foyer during school hours.
- 21) We respect the local customs and dress appropriately.
